## 2) Learning Commons Statement draft

The draft was circulated among the members for their feedback and comments.

- At the December 2010 LC retreat it was apparent that while the LC partners share
  a core philosophy and approach to academic literacies, these principles were not
  yet articulated. We proposed to draft a statement that would articulate them.
- The statement will be useful in training new LC members, as well as for promotional and communications purposes.
- Patrick O'Neill, Cathy Boyd Withers, Mark Robertson, and Scott McLaren formed a working group to draft the statement.
- Minor changes to the document were suggested. The revised version will be distributed.

# 3) Updates

#### **AIF**

- The Virtual Learning Commons project received AIF funding for its 1<sup>st</sup> year. Total: \$196K.
- The funding is effective as of April 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Will be an elearning toolkit that covers academic literacy range
- Several new hires will have to be made: a web designer, instructional designer, A/V technician and possibly a project manager.
- The platform for the project must not require programming skills to change. We need to be able to continue developing the VLC even after we no longer have a Web Designer.

# Undercurrents - March 24th

- The Library Student Advisory Group (LSAG) helped create the first *Undercurrents* event, a series that is hosted by the York University Libraries and aims at showcasing the work being done by Undergraduate students. This event specifically highlighted the extracurricular activities of four extraordinary students.
- Timothy Bristow and Angela Hamilton led the LSAG students in the development of this event. The event was held in the Collaboratory area of the Learning Commons.
- 4 students presented: Brianna Roberts, Michelle Cho, Marcus Joo, and Meara Tubman-Broeren.
