



## **Part-time Librarian York University Libraries**

York University is the leading interdisciplinary research and teaching university in Canada. York offers a modern, academic experience at the undergraduate and graduate levels in Toronto – Canada’s most international city. The third largest university in the country, York is host to a dynamic academic community of 62,000 students, faculty and staff, as well as 295,000 alumni worldwide. York’s 11 Faculties and 25 research centres conduct ambitious, ground-breaking research that is interdisciplinary and cuts across traditional academic boundaries.

### **Description of Position:**

York University Libraries’ (YUL) Division of Research and Open Scholarship seeks a dynamic and innovative librarian to work on a part-time basis, primarily supporting consultations, projects, and teaching in the areas of research data management and research visibility for York University Libraries.

The Open Scholarship Department supports the university’s research intensification priorities by providing expertise in scholarly communications, open access publishing, research data management, research visibility, and advanced data services.

### **Specific Duties:**

Reporting to the Director, Open Scholarship, the successful candidate will:

- Provide research data management services to faculty, staff, and students such as providing consultations on creating data management plans, advising on research data management best practices, and assisting researchers on depositing and publishing research data to data repositories such as York University Dataverse.
- Provide research visibility consultations to faculty, staff, and students on topics such as traditional and alternative research metrics and researcher profiles.
- Assist in the project management of research visibility projects such as affiliation cleanup projects using tools such as Scopus or Web of Science.
- Teach research data management workshops and research visibility workshops in person and online.
- Create/maintain online research guides and tutorials in the areas of research data management and research visibility.
- Perform other duties as assigned.

### **Qualifications:**

- An ALA-accredited MLS or equivalent.
- Experience instructing or training individuals or groups/classes in an academic library context
- Demonstrated ability to deliver user-centered workshops clearly and concisely.

- Demonstrated knowledge of Data Management Plans (DMPs), research data management principles and best practices (e.g., FAIR principles data deposit and publishing options relevant to a broad range of disciplines (e.g., Borealis, Federated Research Data Repository)
- Familiarity with general library resources with a focus on bibliometrics tools such as Scopus, SciVal, Web of Science, Dimensions, and Altmetric Explorer for Institutions.
- Demonstrated experience and strong communication skills in negotiating research queries including the ability to both teach and contextualize relevant resources relative to a patron's information needs.
- Demonstrated strong service orientation in supporting diverse users
- A commitment to high quality service
- Strong interpersonal, written, and oral communication skills
- Demonstrated knowledge of and ability to use current technologies used in libraries.
- Strong record of teamwork and ability to learn quickly and be able to perform in a fast-paced working environment.

**Number of Hour per Week:**

15 hours per week.

Classes are normally scheduled between 8:30am – 5:00pm, with some evening exceptions, and with a minimum of 2 weeks of notification. Availability for flexible scheduling, Monday to Friday, in person availability is required. Non-classroom work, including preparation time, will be scheduled accordingly.
